**End State:** Fort Hood Community has embraced NZW and is actively supporting the effort











How Much Trash Goes into our Landfill?







## What goes into the Landfill?










- Copperas Cove and Fort Hood Family Housing single-stream recycling

- Working on regional solutions for a local MRF to develop in the region








- Not always enough city personnel with the right expertise or spare time
- Too many objectives at once, and original expectations were too high
- A lot of time is spent on <u>education and training</u> (staff and residents)
- Need dedicated staff to work net zero objectives
- Need better accountability with formalized committees
- Need City Council approval and City Manager buy-in
- Has to be a popular demand from city residents for sustainability
- City voters must demand change, which is done through education







- Dedicated sustainability staff person at each city via grants or <u>fellowship program</u>
- <u>Site Assistance</u> Visits from EPA to prioritize strategies and share best practices
- Feasibility Studies to help crunch the numbers
- Sample Ordinance language for environmental or Net Zero efforts with associated economics
- Basic economic and environmental returns on environmental initiatives that are <u>simple to use</u> and easy to access to help sell ideas to city councils, city staff, and residents






