
- Just prior to the 2015 Annual



What's all the buzz about caffeine?

- Students answered trivia questions related to caffeine pharmacology and dose-response and guessed the caffeine content of common consumer products.
- > 95% of participants found this event to be "very informative" or "somewhat informative".
- SOT booth volunteers sported t-shirts with a caffeine molecule.
 - Did you know that a carbon anhydride bond is the only thing distinguishing caffeine from chocolate?




